# PRIEST'S PRATTLE

## THE GREAT THREE DAYS OF EASTER

The Easter Triduum (*pronounced tri-doo-em*) is a liturgical period of three days which celebrates and remembers Christ's passion, death and resurrection. Christ's absence and presence. The Easter Triduum is also known as the Passiontide, or the Great three days, or the great Paschal mystery. Whatever we call it, the great three days of Easter refers to the liturgical season that concludes Lent and introduces us to conflicting emotions of reflection, pensiveness, sadness, disbelief and of course joy and overwhelming gratitude for Christ's sacrifice for us.

The Triduum officially begins with the Foot Washing on Maundy Thursday, through the overnight Vigil, to the Mass of the Pre-Sanctified on Good Friday Morning, to the joy and celebration of Easter Day. They are a time to think, remember and reflect and should be thought of as one service not many. The Triduum is a continuum. But, our descent into solemnity begins today, on Palm Sunday, where we enter Jerusalem with Christ in triumph and joy, but quickly descends to betrayal, pain and suffering as we listen to Christ's passion and death. We then sit with these emotions through Holy Week. In our remembrance of this time, we offer a Eucharist service every day of Holy Week, to encourage our participation in the event; to foster our remembering and to cement our purpose for being Christian in the first place.

To help with our journey, I encourage you to journey with us at services this week.  
Monday Eucharist 9.30am, at Regis aged care, where you are welcome to join us. If you would like a lift, please let me know and meet me at St Peter's at 8.45am.  
Tuesday 10.00am here at St Peter's, with the MU group.  
Wednesday 10.00am here at St Peter's  
Thursday begins our Triduum at 7.00pm here at St Peter's  
Friday 9.30am Mass of the Pre-Sanctified and 2.00pm Stations of the Cross  
Sunday 5.30am Lighting the New Fire and the 8.00am Eucharist, where we are joyful and triumphant in the knowledge that Christ is with us always.

During our Easter journey, we move from death to life, darkness to light, sadness to joy. Our Lenten journey of hope, has had us move from anarchy to order, from hate and betrayal to hope and joy. I'm not joking with you when I say, the coming week and particularly the great three days are an emotional journey, but they are a journey I encourage you to take. Easter is at the core of who we are as Christians; Jesus and God's love is our why for being, our why for existing and our why for all we say and do every day of the year.

So as we enter with joy into Jerusalem with Jesus this week and wave our palm branches and hold onto our Palm Crosses, may we start our preparation for Holy Week and the great three days; the Easter Triduum, and make a commitment to try and attend to God during these days, perhaps by trying to attend all the services offered. But definitely, by fully submerging ourselves into the mystery of Holy Week, where we may gain some insight into how God works through this time in our own journey through life.

Have a most blessed Holy Week and preparation for the Easter Triduum
