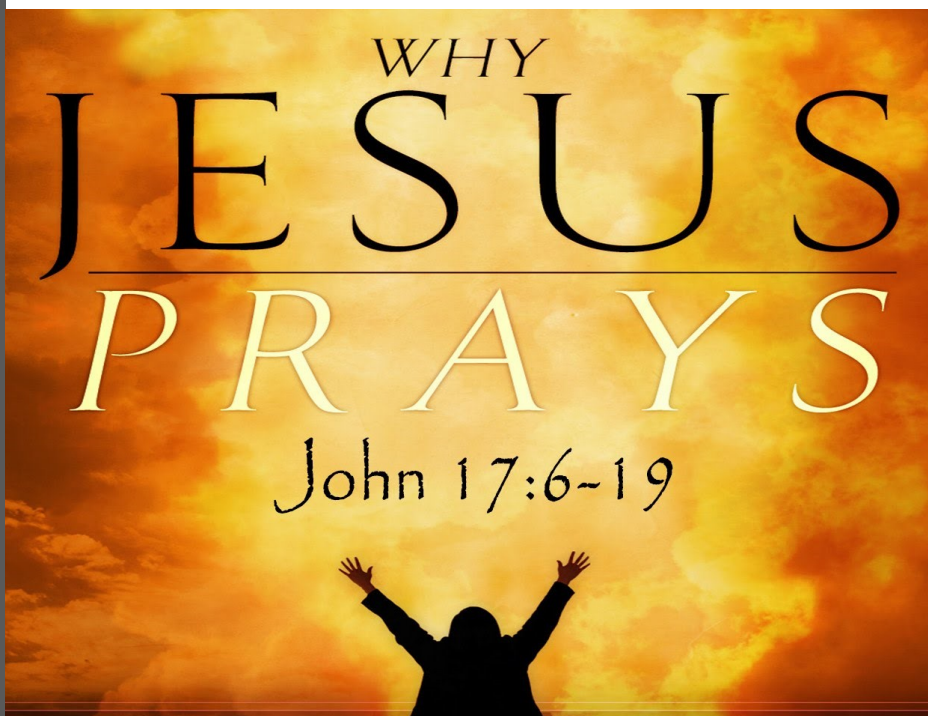

PRIEST'S PRATTLE

What happens when we pray, Your Kingdom Come? You might have heard me bang on about prayer before. What it does, how it changes us, what is the point. Well, I just read an incredible explanation by Calvin T Samual who is a very smart and accredited theologian and professor in London. His explanation is a little convoluted and drawn out, but also so simple. Prayer changes us and what's more, its supposed to. That's the whole point. Here's a précis of what he's talking about.

All too often when we pray 'your kingdom come' what we really mean is 'God! please fix that problem over there.' When we pray, we might pray for others, for the world, for rescue, for help, for justice, for direction, whatever, and this is right and proper. However, whatever it is we pray for, the primary object upon which our prayers have an effect, is us, ourselves. I would like to suggest that this is both the outcome of divine grace as well as divine wisdom. It is the outcome of divine grace, because God gives us more than we ask for, and divine grace because it also addresses the situation within ourselves, for which we have not prayed.

God recognises that we do not know how to pray as we ought. So, all too often, when we pray 'your kingdom come' what we really mean is 'God please fix that problem over there.' Without ever realising that we need to actually fix the problem over here. God recognises that the real issue lies within us. So, God addresses the issue in me, in order to address the issues about which I have concerns.

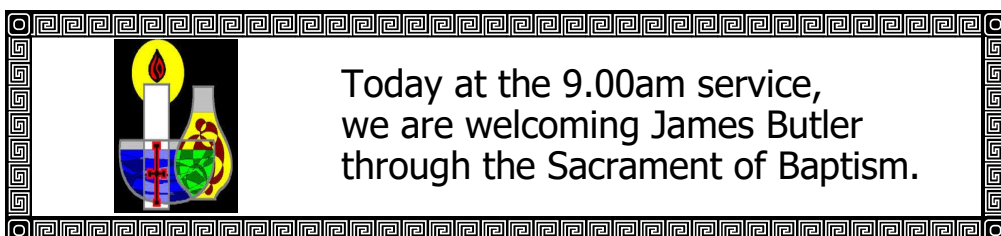
Are you still with me?

So, when I pray that God will help my husband to be a better spouse to me, God answers that prayer by transforming my heart to make me a better wife. When we pray for God to change the world, the first thing that God does is to change us, so that we can change the world. When we pray for patience, or consolation, or fortitude or empathy, we are given opportunities to be patient, or strong, or tender, or loving. And when we pray for divine retribution, God changes our hearts so that we can contemplate divine forgiveness. When we pray for the Church to grow, God gives us a passion for those who do not yet know Jesus and the confidence to share the Good News of the gospel with them. In many ways, it hardly matters what we pray for, because the primary object upon which our prayers have an effect, is ourselves.

So, if you don't want to change, I suggest that you stay well away from prayer, because serious, consistent and diligent prayer, will mess up your life! However, this is precisely why we pray your kingdom come, not only because we recognise that we do not know how to pray as we ought, but also, because we can see that we are so easily blinded to those areas of our lives which are most in need of divine transformation. In praying 'your kingdom come' not only do we invite God to have God's way in God's world, more crucially, we invite God to have God's way in us. 'Your Kingdom Come'.
